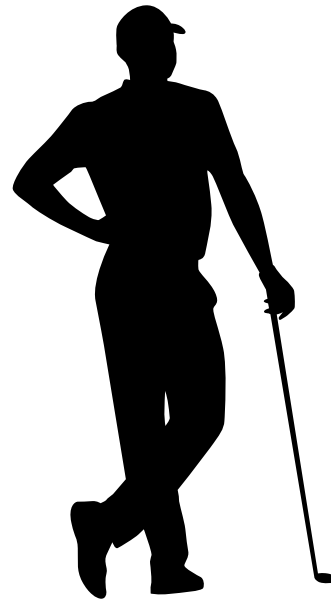

Welcome Back to Our Returning and New Dining Room Team Members

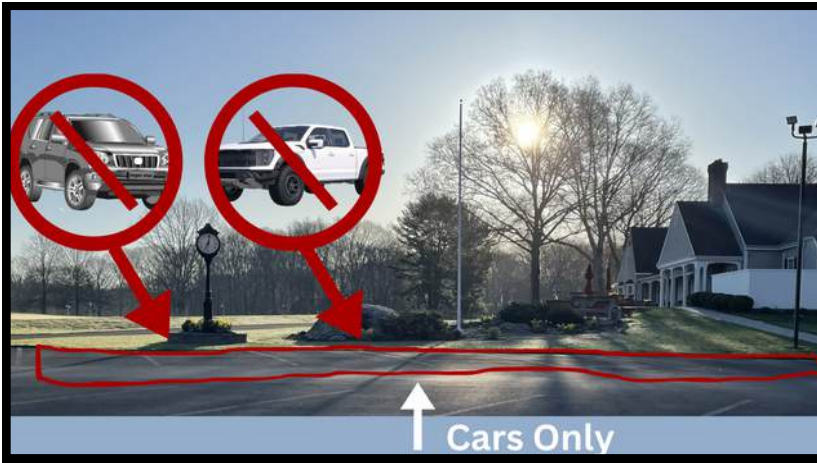

A Paws-itively Great Addition to the Team

Chris is very excited to introduce the newest member of the maintenance team, Ace. Ace is 5 months old and learning how to behave on the golf course. Please do not give Ace treats until Chris has fully trained him.

Reminders:

The golf course, including ALL practice facilities, is closed until noon on Mondays and Tuesdays after a holiday. This is an important time for our crew to work efficiently and unimpeded by players on the course.

Please fix your ball marks on the greens. I should not have to say this but on the Memorial Day weekend there were too many unrepaired ball marks.

Please follow correct range practices: I am re-printing the column Rich Paterson wrote last year when we instituted new range procedures. These practices coupled with meticulous agronomic management allowed us to use the grass range through most of the season. Please remember the grass range will be closed when it is too wet, on Mondays and one more weekday. Weekend use of the grass may also be staggered. Call ahead if you want to be sure it is open.

HOW TO PROPERLY PRACTICE FROM THE GRASS ON OUR RANGE

We can't expect to have a usable grass surface throughout the season unless all members are aware of the best practices for conserving the surface during use. To this effort the Green Committee provided new signs on all of the ball boxes that describe the proper method of displacing the turf in order to minimize the damage and allow for timely regeneration. The signs have little effect if players are oblivious to what they convey.



While there is near 100% grass coverage at the start of the season, once the grass is removed it is a real struggle to get multiple regenerations of that grass throughout the season. Unless we all pay attention to the proper use, the grass surface becomes unusable too soon and that leaves us with more days spent hitting from the artificial mats. The middle of the sign reads GOOD relating to the pattern that divots should be taken during practice.

All About the Greens continued

Divots should be in narrow straight rows leaving an inch of undisturbed grass in between. This practice promotes the growth of grass to fill in the divots from the side in addition to whatever growth may come from existing roots. The sign also indicates how divots should not be taken. BAD is hacking them out in big ovals or random patterns. If you are practicing shots with your sand wedge or similar clubs and you tend to gouge out big divots PLEASE LIMIT the number of shots you take so the grass in that area is not destroyed for the rest of the season.



So the bottom line is FOLLOW THESE PRACTICES AND WE WILL BE SPENDING MORE TIME ON THE GRASS AND LESS ON THE MATS.

Please Don't Spray Bug Repellent on the Grass



On Thursday, May 29th, someone had bug spray on their shoes and damaged the practice putting green. It took ten man hours to repair the damage.

Bug repellent sprays may keep the bugs away, but they're extremely harmful to our turf. Many sprays contain chemicals that can burn or kill the grass, leading to unsightly damage and costly repairs. Please apply repellent to your skin or clothing while standing in the parking lot or on a hard surface — never on the grass. Help us keep the greens healthy and beautiful for everyone!

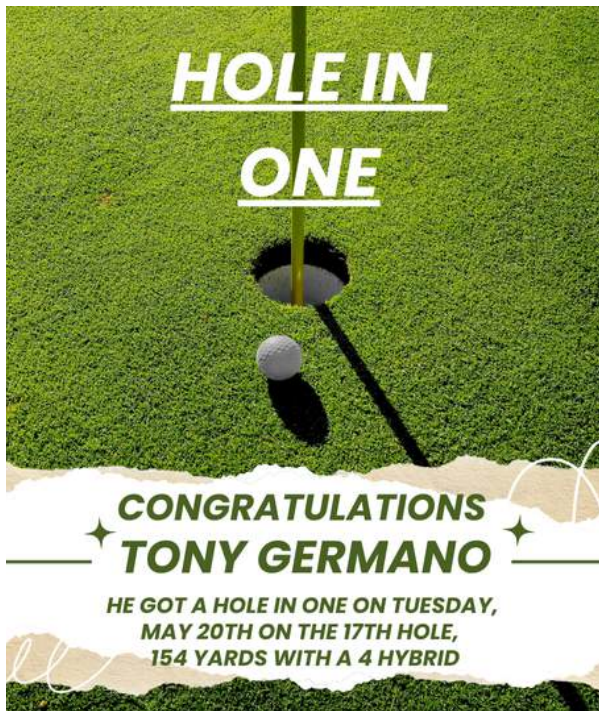

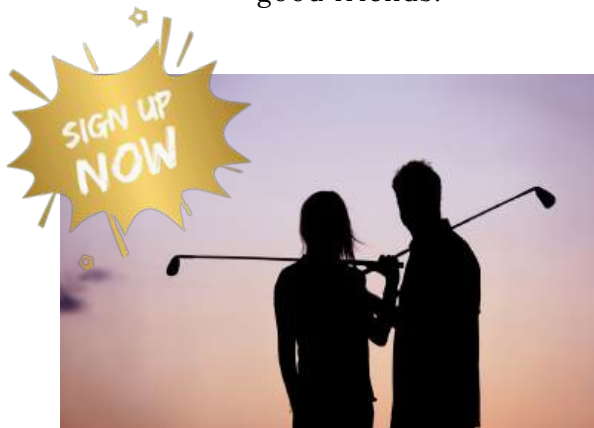
